Building Knowledge to Lead Change

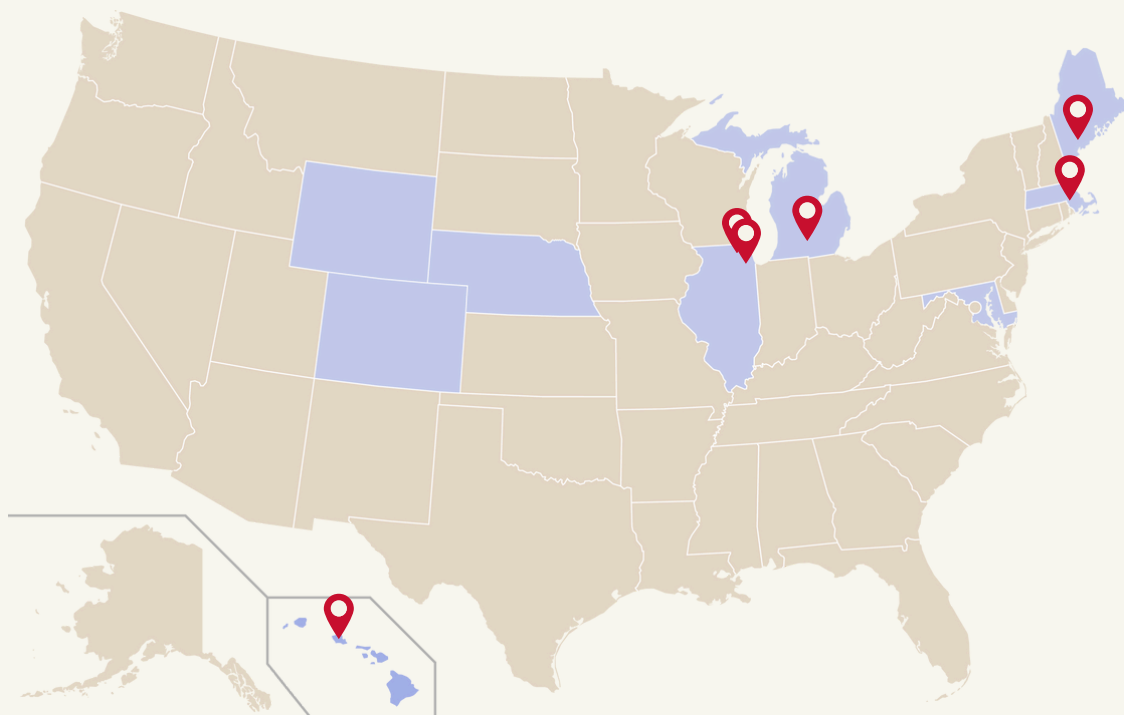

Partnering with States and Communities

In 2025, CELFE partnered with states and communities to redesign compensation strategies, develop salary scales, and strengthen the financial foundations of early care and education systems, supporting leaders in making more equitable and sustainable decisions.



CELFE helped us see compensation through a new lens and understand how cost modeling and salary scales can guide stronger workforce strategies. This work will help to move our Compensation Design Team's goals forward and inform future ECE initiatives.
